Why keep this notice?

Temporary Work (subclass 482) visa conditions Temporary Work activity (visa condition 9682)

This condition means that you are allowed to engage in any work other than a Temporary Work activity while you are in Australia.

Maximum Two years study (visa condition 9201)

This condition means that you are only allowed to engage in up to but not exceeding Twoe years of study or training while you are in Australia.

Tuberculosis free (visa condition 9527)

It is a requirement that you are free from tuberculosis disease when you travel to and enter Australia.

No criminal convictions (visa condition 9528)

This condition means that you must not have any criminal convictions for a sentence(s) (served or not) of 12 months or more (in total) at the time you travel to and enter Australia.

Information pack on domestic and family violence, sexual assault and forced marriage

Character requirements

Entering or remaining in Australia is a privilege. You must obey the law and not engage in criminal activity.

Your visa may be cancelled for a number of reasons, including if you have a substantial criminal record or behave in a way that is a risk to somebody in the Australian community.
